INCLUDED IN PRICE:

- 2) Taxes and fuel charges totaling **\$705 USD** comprised of **\$374.60** for fuel charges (subject to increase by airline up to 30 days prior to departure) and **\$330.40** for taxes (including federal inspection fees for the U.S. Customs and Immigrations; international air transportation tax; agricultural tax; other per person taxes imposed by government entities; airport taxes and fees including the September 11th Security fee up to \$10 per person, passenger facility charges up to \$18 per person, federal domestic flight segment fees up to \$3.50 per segment and U.S. and International arrival and departure, and other government imposed fees up to \$300 per person).

NOT INCLUDED IN PRICE:

Not included in your package are passports, visas, COVID-19 tests, vaccinations, laundry, lunches, telephone, mini-bar, alcohol, other beverages, and food outside of the contracted tour operator menu as presented at a hotel or restaurant (these extra items will be billed to you before leaving the hotel, or restaurant), airport transfers on non-qualifying flights, portage at airports, travel insurance, excess baggage fees, any fees or fuel surcharges imposed by the airlines after the date you register for your trip, and all other items not specifically mentioned.

PAYMENT:

A full deposit of \$500 per person is required at time of registration. Credit cards are only accepted for the initial deposit. **All other remaining payments must be made in the form of a check, including final payment.** Final payment is **due no later than 100-days prior to departure.** Registrations received after 100-days prior to departure must be accompanied by full payment. Registrations received between 90-75 days prior to departure are subject to a \$300 late fee.

Tour pricing is based on a minimum group size of 26 passengers to be valid. *The following supplements may apply for smaller groups:* 25-20 travelers, \$145 per person 19-15 travelers, \$195 per person; 14-10 travelers, \$235 per person. If group size is less than 10 travelers, the tour may be canceled due to lack of participation. **If final (full) payment is not received by Imagine Tours and Travel, LLC (hereafter referred to as Imagine) 75-days prior to departure, you will be automatically cancelled from the tour and your initial deposit of \$500 will be forfeited and additional fees may apply.** Imagine reserves the right to add a surcharge if the dollar declines by more than 2% against the shekel or euro based on foreign exchange rates in effect on date (08/25/23) when your tour was booked by your tour leader/church. **All payments are required in US Funds.**

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Price is based on double occupancy (two persons sharing a room). When available, single rooms are often smaller than doubles. While Imagine will try to match roommates, we cannot guarantee one will be available. Roommates may be assigned as late as 75 days prior to departure. If one is not available or if you request a single room, there will be a **single room supplement charge of \$1,796 for the basic itinerary.**

ITINERARY & CHANGES:

Because airlines often change flight schedules after brochures are printed, Imagine reserves the right to shorten or lengthen the itinerary accordingly. You will be notified in writing when possible. If itinerary changes necessitate extra overnights, you will be charged \$195 per night/per person (single rooms \$225/night). Meals for extra nights are not included. **Any changes and/or deviations from the program and/or departure city listed, by the passenger, must be provided in writing to Imagine no later than 100-days prior to departure and any extra costs incurred will be billed to the passenger.** All deviations are subject to a standard fee of \$150 plus any applicable airline fees. **All tours are final at 70-days prior to departure. No changes and/or additions may be made to the tour after that time.**

LAND ONLY:

Land Only price is \$7,485 per person. Price does not include international flights. Land Only passengers may be responsible for transfers and/or additional overnights incurred by booking their own flights. We recommend you purchase a ticket which can be changed without large penalties, as the group's flights may change. Passengers changing from the regular tour to Land Only after 120 days prior to departure will be charged a fee of \$150 per person.

AIRLINE TICKETS:

In order to keep prices low, **Imagine does not guarantee you will be on the most direct flights to your final destination. Imagine also does not guarantee the group will be on the same flights, particularly if registering 100 days prior to departure.** Flight routings are chosen by the airlines and not Imagine. Airline tickets cannot be changed or refunded once issued. Air transportation to/from your destination will be economy class aboard IATA and ARC carriers utilizing APEX or SUPER APEX non-refundable, non-amendable tickets for groups of 10 or more flying together for entire itinerary. Imagine is unable to use individual frequent flyer points to upgrade or accept them as partial payment for air transportation. Deviations by the passenger, from the group's scheduled flights, could result in different routings/air carriers. Airline changes, if allowable, made by the passenger after final payment has been made, may incur additional fees.

FLIGHT TIMES:

All flight times are subject to change by the airlines without advance notice. Imagine is not responsible for such changes or delays and does not reimburse expenses resulting from such delays. If making your own flight arrangements to a departure city or any other portion of your trip, we recommend you purchase a ticket which can be changed without large penalties. All passengers are responsible for reconfirming their flights with the airline 24 hours prior to departure.

PASSPORT:

Each passenger is responsible for making sure that they have a **valid passport that has an expiration date at least six months after the date of return from their trip.** A copy of your valid passport must be submitted to our office by 100 days prior to departure.

VISAS:

Applicable visas will be obtained by Imagine for U.S. and Canadian Citizens only. All passengers who do not carry U.S. or Canadian Passports will be responsible for obtaining visas to the countries they are visiting. Imagine is not responsible for non-U.S. & Canadian Passport holders.

TRIP RESCHEDULING:

Imagine and/or Trip leader reserve the right to re-schedule the dates of the Trip to future dates TBD due to governmental action, pandemic, or other circumstances beyond their control. Should that occur, all travelers will be rebooked for the new dates. Travelers unable to travel on the new dates may cancel their participation and will be assessed a cancellation fee of up to \$300 per person, plus any additional penalties/fees imposed by ground operator(s), airlines, or other vendors. Travelers can transfer to another available tour up to one year from their original departure date.

CANCELLATION FEES:

Any passenger cancelling from the day of registration to 100 days prior to departure will be charged a **\$300 non-refundable administrative fee** per person plus any airline penalties, if applicable. You will also be charged a single room fee if your cancellation forces your roommate into a single room from 75 days prior until the date of departure. The following charges also apply: 99-75 days = **\$500**; 74-55 days = **\$1950**; 54-41 days = **75% of total cost**; 40 days to day of departure = **100% of total cost. All cancellations must be received in writing. On or after the day of departure there is no refund for any services not used. We strongly recommend you purchase travel insurance.** If Imagine cancels the tour due to lack of participation, there will be a charge of \$200 deducted from the amount refunded to each passenger for administrative fees plus any airline penalties if applicable. No changes may be made to the tour within 70-days of departure, as the tour is officially closed.

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Days 1 & 2 - Friday - Saturday, November 7-8: Flight from U.S. to Egypt, Hotel in Cairo

We depart for this "granddaddy" trip of a lifetime covering three biblical countries by flying from the U.S. to Egypt. We'll fly through Europe en route to Cairo. Upon arrival, we will meet our travel agent who will walk us through the passport control procedure. We then meet our Egyptian tour guide and driver. We drive to our hotel for dinner and an optional walk along the Nile River.

Day 3 – Sunday, November 9: Memphis, Sakkara, the Pyramids, and Sphinx, Egyptian Museum

Following breakfast, we drive to Sakkara, the necropolis of the Old Capital of Memphis. We view the Step Pyramid of King Zoser and a mastaba (tomb of the nobles), including the tomb of Ti and Ptah. We then drive to Giza and after a quick snack, we visit the Great Pyramids and the Sphinx. We will also enjoy a panoramic view of the pyramids, and if you like, on the back of a camel. We end the day by visiting the new Egyptian Museum! This new museum contains unbelievable artifacts from the past, including the treasures of King Tutankhamen. Time permitting, you will have time to also visit the mummy room (for an extra fee). We return to our hotel for dinner.

Day 4 – Monday, November 10: Morning Flight to Luxor, Luxor/Valley of Kings, Temples of Medinet Habu, Hatshepsut, Felucca Boat Ride on Nile River

After breakfast, we drive to the Cairo airport for our flight to Luxor, an area referred to as the "heart of Egypt!" Upon arriving, we begin our sightseeing of the west bank of the Nile River to see the Valley of the Kings, Medinet Habu Temple, Hatshepsut Temple, and Colossi of Memnon. We end the day with a felucca boat ride across the Nile River. We return to our hotel in Luxor for dinner.



Day 5 – Tuesday, November 11: Temple of Karnak, Temple of Luxor, Flight to Cairo & Amman, Jordan

Following breakfast, we visit the massive Temple of Karnak. This is an impressive Temple complex built over the centuries with connections with pharaohs such as Thutmose III, Hatshepsut, Seti I, Ramses II, and Shishak (mentioned in the Bible). This temple has huge pylons, tall pillars, and important hieroglyphic inscriptions that connect us to the Bible. We then visit the classic Temple of Luxor. Here we see the larger statues of Ramses II as we walk through this smaller Egyptian cultic center. In the midafternoon we board our flight to Cairo and then our connecting flight to Amman, Jordan to begin our visit of our second biblical country. We drive to our hotel in Amman for a late dinner.

Day 6 - Wednesday, November 12: Bethany beyond the Jordan, Mt. Nebo, Machaerus, Petra

We begin the day by driving west to the Jordan Valley to Bethany Beyond the Jordan. This area is associated with Elijah and Elisha (2 Kings 2), and Jesus (He was baptized here, John 1). We then drive and ascend to Mt. Nebo to stand where Moses stood and viewed the Holy Land (Deuteronomy 34). Here you can take in a breathtaking view across the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea. We continue to Machaerus, one of Herod's palace-fortresses. It was here where John the Baptist was beheaded (Mark 6). In the afternoon,

we drive south down the Desert Highway to Petra, where we spend the night. We arrive at our hotel just outside the entrance to the ancient site of Petra and enjoy a late dinner together.

Day 7 – Thursday, November 13: Petra, Wadi Rum, Bedouin Village

We arrive this morning at the entrance of Petra and spend the entire day within this red-rose ancient city. We are in the heart of the Seir Mountains, Land of Edomites, mentioned in the Bible in Genesis. These mountains house the Aaron Peak, the highest in Petra and the burial place of Moses' brother Aaron. A walk through the Siq, the main entrance to Petra, brings us to the first monument "The Treasury" "Al-Khazneh" a dramatic site. This well-preserved monumental tomb appears in the movie "Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade." A walk further down through the outer siq with all its tombs and burial chamber brings us to one of the largest theaters in Jordan. A 3000-seat theater from the early first century is carved in the sandstone mountains at the bottom of the High Place of Sacrifice Mountain. Apparently, some sacrificial rituals had taken place here. From here we walk uphill to the Royal Tombs for a great view of the lower part of Petra with all its Roman remains. There will be the option to walk to the "Monastery" of Petra and/or the High Place. Leaving the site of Petra in mid-afternoon, we drive south to Wadi Rum. Here we enjoy an amazing jeep ride in the desert. We then stay in Wadi Rum at Captain's, a Bedouin Village. We enjoy dinner together and a devotional time under the stars. It will be a unique experience!

Day 8 – Friday, November 14: Southern Border Crossing into Israel, Red Sea, Timnah, Dead Sea

Following breakfast, we leave Wadi Rum and drive to the southern border to cross into Israel. Greeted once again by our Israeli guide and bus, we make a brief stop to see the coral reefs of the Red Sea. We will have a chance to swim in these crystal-clear waters. From here we drive north through the Aravah (Rift Valley) to Timnah. In ancient days, this was a copper mine of the Egyptians. We also walk through a full-size replica of the Old Testament Tabernacle. Continuing north along the Aravah, we arrive at the Dead Sea. After checking into our hotel, you will have a chance to float in this unique body of water (33% salt & minerals)! Dinner at your leisure ends this first day in Israel, our third biblical country of this extensive trip!

Day 9 – Saturday, November 15: Masada, Ein Gedi, Qumran, Judean Desert

Following breakfast, we drive to the famous site of Masada. We ascend to the top in the cable car. Originally, this was a palace-fortress built by Herod the Great. Later, 967 Jewish zealots who resisted the Romans for about three years after the Jerusalem Temple was destroyed used this stand-alone fortress as a place of refuge. We will see palaces, casemate walls, a synagogue, storerooms, and a bathhouse. Leaving the site, we have the option of walking down the Snake Path, while others ride the cable car down. Next, we drive north along the Dead Sea to Ein Gedi, where we relive the story of David hiding in a cave from King Saul (1 Samuel 24). We will have the opportunity to hike into the valley and enjoy the waterfalls. Further north is Qumran, the settlement of the first century sect known as the Essenes, the authors of the Dead Sea Scrolls. Those who want to can spend time hiking near some of the caves where the scrolls were discovered. At the site, we see first century miqvat (ritual baths), a scriptorium, and cisterns. We end the day (hopefully for sunset) by overlooking the Judean Desert and Wadi Qelt. We will hear the words of Isaiah 40 and Psalm 23 shared here. We return to our hotel at the Dead Sea.

Day 10 – Sunday, November 16: Jericho, Shiloh, Beth Shean, Mt. Gilboa, Tiberias

We begin the day at nearby Jericho. Here, we see the portion of the actual revetment wall dating to the time of Joshua (Joshua 6). We then drive through the Parath Desert where we will stop and enjoy a brief hike. We consider the role of the prophet Jeremiah here (Jeremiah 13). From here it's on to the ancient site of Shiloh. Here we revisit the stories of Eli, Samuel, and the Ark (1 Samuel 2-4) and see where the Tabernacle once stood. We will take time to reflect upon Samuel's response to God, "Here, I am!" (Hineni, in Hebrew). We then drive through the hill country of Samaria,

talking about the stories that occurred here at nearby Bethel (Genesis 28), Shechem (Joshua 24), and Sychar (John 4). Our next site is Beth Shean, a massive Roman city. This is where the body of Saul was hung on the city walls (1 Samuel 31), but in the days of Jesus, it was a large Roman city. To end the day, we drive to the top of Mt. Gilboa for a great view of the Jezreel and Harod Valleys and the life and death of King Saul (1 Samuel 31). We drive to the western shoreline of the Sea of Galilee to our hotel. We enjoy dinner together and a brief gathering by the water's edge.

Day 11 – Monday, November 17: Dan, Caesarea Philippi, Syrian Border, Qatzrin, Hippos

We begin the day by driving north along the Huleh Valley to the amazing nature preserve and archaeological site of Dan, one of the sources of the Jordan River. We walk through this quiet national park and hear the stories of disobedience that took place here (Judges 18, 1 Kings 12). We also see some amazing archaeology here! Close by is Caesarea Philippi. It was in the region of this pagan city where Jesus asked His disciples, "Who do you say I am?" (Mt. 16). We will see the Grotto (cultic area) of this city. Then we begin ascending into the Golan Heights. We will drive past Mt. Hermon (Psalm 133) to the border with Syria. Here we learn about the modern wars of Israel, primarily the 1967 and 1973 wars. From here we drive south on the plateau of the Golan Heights to Katzrin, a partially reconstructed Talmudic village (3rd - 7th centuries AD). We see what a typical village looked like during the days of Jesus. Sitting in a reconstructed stone house, we'll read from Mark 2 about the lame man being lowered down to Jesus through the roof. We end the day at Hippos/Sussita, one of the ten Decapolis cities. Located high on the SE corner of the Sea of Galilee, we will see many Roman ruins here. We will also read from Mark 5 about the demoniac transformed by Jesus. We return to our hotel for dinner and a free evening.



Day 12 - Tuesday, November 18: Arbel, Jordan River/Yardenit, Magdala, Capernaum, Mt. Beatitudes, Boat Ride/Ancient Boat

We begin the day by visiting Arbel, a mountain on the northwest corner of the Sea of Galilee. We will have the option to hike to the top of this 800foot cliff (the bus will take others to the top from the other side). The view from the top is the best there is of the whole Sea of Galilee below! Driving south to the southern end of the Sea of Galilee, we arrive at Yardenit. You will have the opportunity to reaffirm your baptism in the waters of the Jordan River. From here we drive to back to the NW corner of the lake to Magdala, the home of Mary Magdalene. Here we will see another 1st century synagogue, Jesus must have taught from here! Among the other ruins are ritual baths. After lunch (a wonderful "St. Peter's Fish lunch, not included) we see Capernaum, the home center of ministry for Jesus here in Galilee. Here we read about the many stories related to the ministry of Jesus in the 4th-5th century synagogue. It was in this area where Jesus called His first disciples. Just up the hill is the Mount of Beatitudes. We will read from Matthew 5 here, listening to the primary message of Jesus about the kingdom of heaven! We end the day by seeing the "Jesus boat" from the first century, a vessel found here along the shores of Galilee in 1986. We also will enjoy a boat ride on the lake. On the boat we will enjoy a time of worship. We will also the two storm narratives from Mark 4 and Matthew 14. We return to our hotel for dinner and a free evening.

Day 13 – Wednesday, November 19: Precipice of Nazareth, Megiddo, Mt. Carmel, Caesarea, Jerusalem

This morning we depart the Galilee towards Jerusalem. Our first stop will be the Precipice of Nazareth where we will gain our first of a number of views of the Jezreel Valley below. We will talk about Mt. Tabor (Judges 4-5) and the Hill of Moreh (Judges 6-7), among other biblical stories. We will also consider the story of Luke 4. We then drive across the valley to Megiddo, a Canaanite and Israel archaeological site with about 25 layers of occupation. We will climb the site and see many interesting ruins, including the impressive water system. Next, winding our way up and through the Mt. Carmel range, we visit Muhraqa, where we read the story about Elijah and the prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18). Our last site is Caesarea Maritima, to view part of the city initially built by Herod the Great. Here, we visit the theater, palace area, and aqueduct. From here we drive to Jerusalem. After checking in to the hotel and dinner, we enjoy an "orientation walk" to the Western Wall within the Old City.

Day 14 – Thursday, November 20: Jerusalem, Mt. of Olives, Old City, Israel Museum, Yad Vashem

We start the day with an orientation to Jerusalem from the Mt. of Olives. We then follow the traditional Palm Sunday Road to the church known as the Dominus Flevit ("the Lord weeps"). We stop to read the passages related to this area (Luke 19, Acts 1, Zechariah 14). After viewing the Golden Gate, we walk downhill to Gethsemane, where we take time to meditate on the Gospel text. From here, we enter the Old City, where we first visit the Pools of Bethesda (John 5) and St. Anne's Church, perfectly preserved from the Crusader period with remarkable acoustics. We then walk the Via Dolorosa to the Holy Sepulcher, one of two possible locations for Christ's crucifixion and burial. In the afternoon we drive to West Jerusalem, where we visit the Israel Museum and the spectacular Jerusalem Model of the Second Temple Period. Dr. DeLancey will take us around the archaeological display, seeing the highlighted artifacts from sites we visited. We end the day by visiting Yad Vashem and the Holocaust Memorial. We return to our hotel for dinner and overnight in Jerusalem. After dinner you will have the opportunity to hear Shlomo's family story about the Holocaust.

Day 15 – Friday, November 21: City of David, Southern Excavations, Jewish Quarter

We begin the day by entering the City of David and the excavations of David's palace (2 Samuel 5) Those who want to can take an optional adventurous walk through the water of Hezekiah's Tunnel (1,720 feet long, 2 Kings 20, 2 Chronicles 32, Isaiah 8 & 37). We then sit on the steps of the Siloam Pool and listen to the story of the blind man healed by Jesus (John 9). From here, we walk to the southern Temple excavations through a 1,300 foot newly discovered Herodian drainage tunnel. We exit at the southwest corner of the Temple and the southern steps. We see the massive stones erected by King Herod and sit on the very steps used by Jesus and His disciples. From here, we visit the Jewish Quarter for a late lunch on our own and some free time in the Old City.

Day 16 – Saturday, November 22: Garden Tomb, Herodium, Bethlehem

In the morning, we begin with a visit to Herodium, located on the edge of the Judean Desert, where Herod the Great was buried (Matthew 2). We see the brand-new excavations related to Herod's tomb! Close by is the Shepherds' Field in Bethlehem. We step into a cave and read from Luke 2 as well as sing a few Christmas carols. We will also stop at an olive wood factory and store. In the afternoon, you will have some free time in the Old City to explore or shop on your own. We end the day with a visit to the Garden Tomb. Here, we will enjoy a Communion Service. This location is a second possible site for the crucifixion and burial of Jesus. Enjoy a "Farewell" dinner at local restaurant before driving to the airport for our evening flight back to the U.S.

Day 17 – Sunday, November 23: Return Home

After our night flight home, we arrive back in the U.S. After Passport Control, we find our domestic connecting flights back.
