NOT INCLUDED IN PRICE:

Passports, visa/ETA, vaccinations (if required), laundry, lunches not on the tour menu (food outside of the contracted menu will be billed prior to leaving the hotel or restaurant), excursions not listed, telephone/international data, mini-bar, alcohol, other beverages, airport transfers on non-qualifying flights, portage at airports, excess baggage fees, additional airline fees after registration, travel insurance, and all other items not explicitly mentioned.

PAYMENTS & FEES:

A non-refundable deposit of \$500 per person is due upon registration, with a second deposit of \$500 per person required within 21 days thereafter.

Credit cards are only accepted for the initial \$500 deposit; subsequent payments must be in check, ACH transfer, bill payment, or wire transfer;

all payments are required in US Funds.

Final payment is due no later than 120 days prior to departure.

Registrations after 120 days require full payment and may incur a \$300 late fee if received 119-90 days before departure. **Failure to make final payment by 90 days prior to departure results in automatic cancellation, forfeiture of the \$500 deposit, and potential additional fees.**

Imagine Tours and Travel, LLC (hereafter referred to as *Imagine*) reserves the right to impose a surcharge if the dollar declines by more than 2% against the destination currency based on booking date (06/04/26).

GROUP SIZE & SUPPLEMENTS:

Tour pricing assumes a minimum group size of 20 passengers.

Smaller groups may incur supplements:

- \$150 per person (19-16 travelers)
- \$195 per person (15-14 travelers)
- \$295 per person (13-12 travelers)

Tours with fewer than 12 travelers may be canceled due to insufficient participation.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Price is based on double occupancy (two people sharing a room). Single rooms may be smaller than double rooms and, when available, incur an **additional supplemental charge of \$1,327 for the basic itinerary.** Roommates are assigned if available; otherwise, single-room occupancy may apply. *Roommates may be assigned as late as 120 days prior to departure when applicable.*

ITINERARY & CHANGES:

Imagine reserves the right to adjust itineraries due to airline schedule changes. Changes requiring extra nights incur \$195 per person per night (\$295 for single rooms). You will be notified in writing of said changes when possible. Meals for additional overnights are not included. Changes and/or deviations from the program and/or departure city listed by the passenger must be provided in writing no later than 120 days prior to departure. **All deviations are subject to a \$250 administrative fee** plus applicable airline fees. **All tours are made final at 90 days prior to departure.**

No changes (including additions) may be made after this time.

LAND ONLY:

Land Only price is \$4,792 per person, excluding international flights.

Land Only passengers may be responsible for transfers and/or additional overnights incurred by booking their own flights. Passengers changing from the regular tour (with group airfare) to Land Only after 120 days prior to departure will be charged a fee of \$195 per person.

AIRLINE TICKETS & SEATING:

Flight routing is at the sole discretion of the airline, not *Imagine*. *Imagine* does not guarantee passengers will be on the most direct flight or flying together to the final destination (especially prior to 120 days of departure). Flights are economy class on IATA/ARC carriers with non-refundable, non-amendable tickets for groups of 10 or more. Group airfare pricing is based on the original group air contract secured by *Imagine*. Once contracted air inventory has been filled, any additional airfare secured for passengers—whether due to late registration, post-final payment additions, or changes requested by the passenger—**may be subject to increased costs**, which are the **responsibility of the passenger**. As such, *Imagine* cannot guarantee that all travelers will be booked on the same flights, particularly for passengers added after the final payment deadline as outlined in *PAYMENTS & FEES*, if airfare is applicable. Due to group rates, *Imagine* does not participate in or allow passengers to use points, miles, vouchers, or other airline-related programs on group contracted airfare. Seat upgrades,

All passengers are responsible for reconfirming their flights with the airline 24 hours prior to departure.

PASSPORTS & VISAS:

Passengers must ensure their **passports are valid for at least six months beyond the return date of their trip** and submit a valid passport copy to our office no later than 120 days prior to departure. Visa requirements vary by country, and it is each passenger's responsibility to obtain necessary visas prior to travel. ***Imagine* is not liable for obtaining any required travel visas.**

TRIP RESCHEDULING:

Imagine and/or the group leader/organization reserves the right to reschedule the trip to **future dates and/or a different destination** due to governmental action, pandemics, wars, or other circumstances beyond their control. Travelers unable to travel on the new dates or to the updated destination may transfer to another tour within one year of the original travel dates, subject to fees of up to \$300 per person, plus any applicable fees imposed by ground operators, airlines, or other vendors.

CANCELLATION FEES:

Passengers cancelling from the day of registration up to 121 days prior to departure **will be charged a \$500 administrative fee** plus any airline penalties, if applicable. If passenger cancellation forces a roommate into a single room, the canceled passenger may be charged their single room fee. ↴

The ITINERARY

Day 1 – Tuesday, February 15: Depart U.S.A.

Tour members meet for our evening flight. After dinner is served, sit back and relax, enjoying the on-board entertainment as you prepare for this exciting adventure of a lifetime.

Day 2 – Wednesday, February 16: Arrive in Israel, Netanya

Upon arrival at Ben Gurion Airport, we meet our local Israeli representative who assists us with baggage and Passport Control. We then meet our guide and driver as we make our way north to our hotel in Netanya for dinner and overnight beside the beautiful Mediterranean Sea. An optional walk on the beach can be enjoyed after dinner!

Day 3 – Thursday, February 17: Caesarea, Carmel, Megiddo, Precipice of Nazareth, Tiberias

After an abundant breakfast buffet, we journey north along the coast to Caesarea, built 2000 years ago by King Herod. We walk through the ancient theater, the Crusader city and the fantastic aqueduct that served as a backdrop for the book of Acts. From here, we depart to Mt. Carmel (1 Kings 18), site of Elijah's confrontation with the prophets of Baal. Then we proceed to Megiddo (Armageddon; 1 Kings 9:15; Rev. 16:16). Finally, we cross the Jezreel Valley to the precipice of Nazareth (Luke 1 and 4). We end our day here as we are introduced to the life and ministry of Jesus in this area. Driving through Cana (John 2), we finally arrive in Tiberias (John 6:23). We arrive at our hotel located right on the Sea of Galilee shoreline. This is the first of four nights here! After dinner, we enjoy sitting together for a time of fellowship and orientation.

Day 4 – Friday, February 18: Gamla, Katzrin, Syrian Border, Caesarea Philippi, Dan

We begin the day by driving into the Golan Heights. Up on the plateau of the Golan Heights is Gamla. This was a Jewish city involved in the First Revolt against the Romans. An option will be provided to walk down to the 1st century synagogue. There is a high probability that Jesus taught about the Kingdom here (Matthew 4 & 9). Next, we visit the Talmudic Village of Katzrin (also Qatzrin). These ruins date from the 3rd – 7th centuries AD. We will sit in a completely restored stone house and read Mark 2. The story will come alive in great detail! Driving to the border, we next visit the Syrian Border. Here, we learn about the modern wars of Israel, primarily the 1967 and 1973 wars with Syria. Driving past Mt. Hermon (Psalm 133), we descend the Golan Heights and visit Caesarea Philippi. It was here where Jesus asked His disciples, "Who do you say I am?" (Matt. 16). Nearby is the amazing nature preserve and archaeological site of Dan. We walk through this quiet national park and impressive Old Testament city and hear the stories of disobedience that took place here (Judges 18, 1 Kings 12). We drive back to our hotel in Tiberias. After dinner, we again meet together to review the day.

Day 5 – Saturday, February 19: Hippos, Jordan River, Magdala, Chorizim (Optional Walk to Capernaum), Capernaum, Sea of Galilee Boat Ride

Our first stop is Hippos, located on the east side of the lake and one of the Decapolis cities in the days of Jesus. We will see many Roman ruins here, plus a great view of the Sea of Galilee. We will consider the story of Mark 5 and the demoniac's transformation. We then drive to the southern end of the lake to Yardenit. Here, an optional baptism will take place. Next, we drive to Magdala to see another ancient synagogue that dates to the time of Christ. Mary "Magdalene" was also from here (Luke 8). Located also on this corner of the Sea of Galilee is Chorizim, one of the three cities condemned by Jesus (Matthew 11). We see the basaltic ruins and synagogue which dates to the 2nd-3rd centuries. From here, we will provide an optional walk on a new trail that leads to Capernaum, the home center of ministry for Jesus in Galilee (those not doing the walk will be driven to Capernaum). Here, we read from the Gospels about the many things that took place here (Mark 1, Luke 7 & John 6) in the 4th-5th century synagogue. To end the day, we see the "Jesus boat" from the first century, a vessel found here along the shores of Galilee in 1986. Next, we enjoy our own boat ride on the Sea of Galilee, with a quiet and peaceful worship service together. We recall the storm narratives (Mark 4 & 6). Upon landing, we return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 6 – Sunday, February 20: Mt. Arbel & Reflection, Khirbet Cana, Hike in Upper Galilee (Hill 713) Khirbet Cana

We begin the day with a visit to Arbel, a mountain NW of the Sea of Galilee. An option will be given to hike to the top of this 800-foot cliff (the bus will take others to the top from the other side). The view from on top is the best there is of the whole Sea of Galilee! While on top, we will enjoy some reflection time while reading from Matthew 5-7 as well as Matthew 13. In the afternoon, our unique destination will be Khirbet Cana (weather permitting only), an off-the-beaten-path site just north of the Beit Netofa Valley. We'll need to use a dirt road to get there. The site is where Jesus turned water into wine (John 2) and

where He healed someone from a distance (John 4). We end the day with a short hike to "Hill 713" in the Upper Galilee. We return to our hotel for dinner and another free evening.

Day 7 – Monday, February 21: Beth Shean, Shiloh, Jericho, Ein Booker/Dead Sea

We begin the day by driving south to the Jordan Valley to the site of Beth Shean (1 Sam. 31), an impressive Roman city of the Decapolis. Driving south along the Jordan Valley and then turning west into the area of Samaria, we visit the rather new excavations of Shiloh. This is where the Tabernacle once stood. Here we see impressive archaeological ruins dating to the days of Samuel. Driving past Bethel (Gen. 12, 28) and through the Desert of Parath (Jeremiah 13), our next stop is Jericho. After a late lunch here, we climb the tel (ancient mound) to see portions of the fortification wall that supported the mud-brick walls that "came tumblin' down" (Joshua 6). We end the day by driving to Ein Booker at the southern end of the Dead Sea. You will have a chance to float in the salt and mineral-rich waters of this unique body of water—the Dead Sea either before dinner or before breakfast tomorrow morning! Dinner and overnight are in Ein Bokek.

Day 8 – Tuesday, February 22: Masada, Ein Gedi, Qumran, Judean Desert, Jerusalem, Western Wall

This morning, we drive south to Masada. Here, we ascend high upon the wilderness mountain by way of cable car to the fortress built by King Herod. We survey the ruins of the fortifications, waterworks, synagogue, temples and palaces. An optional walk down the Snake Path will be offered. Next, we continue driving north for about 25 minutes to Ein Gedi. This is where David hid from King Saul (1 Samuel 24). A few other biblical connections will be made. You will have the option to walk back to the highest waterfalls. Located on the northwest corner of the Dead Sea is Qumran. The settlement of Qumran is where the first century sect known as the Essenes authored the Dead Sea Scrolls. We'll hike to the edge of the cliff before seeing the archaeological site and a few of the caves where the scrolls were found. On the way to Jerusalem, we will make a brief stop overlooking the Wadi Qelt in the heart of the Judean Desert. Once we arrive in Jerusalem and check in to our hotel, we will enjoy dinner followed by an optional night walk through the Old City to the Western Wall and back!

Day 9 – Wednesday, February 23: Mt. of Olives, Pool of Bethesda, Holy Sepulcher Church, Herodium, Bethlehem

We get our first glimpse of Jerusalem from the Mt. of Olives, beholding a breath-taking panorama of the Holy City. We walk down the "Palm Sunday" route to the Garden of Gethsemane. Next, we enter the Old City of Jerusalem through the Lion's Gate (St. Stephens) and visit the Pool of Bethesda (John 5). We also enjoy some marvelous singing in St. Anne's Church from the Crusader period. Our walk continues along the traditional Via Dolorosa (the authentic "way of the cross" went the completely opposite direction) to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. In the afternoon, we visit Herodium. Located on the edge of the Judean Desert, this is where Herod the Great was buried. We end the day by driving into Bethlehem to visit the Shepherd's Field, and to shop at an olive wood store. We drive back to our hotel in Jerusalem for dinner and another optional walk.

Day 10 – Thursday, February 24: Yad Vashem, Israel Museum, The "Shephelah" (Lowlands) of Judah: Gezer, Beth Shemesh, Socoh or Azekah

We begin by day by driving to Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust Museum. We will first hear the testimony of our guide on the grounds of the museum before seeing the "Avenue of the Righteous" and the Children's Memorial. We finally walk through the museum on our own. Also located in West Jerusalem is the fascinating Israel Museum! Here, we will see the model of Jerusalem (1:50 scale model of Herodian Jerusalem as it would have appeared in Jesus' time) and the Shrine of the Book (where some of the Dead Sea Scrolls are displayed). Lastly, we will walk through the archaeological museum to see the "highlight" artifacts that connect us to the Bible! In the midafternoon we will drive west down to the Shephelah (lowlands) of Judah to see three Old Testament sites. First will be Gezer located along the Ajalon Valley. Here, we see ruins from the Canaanites to the days of Solomon. Next, in the Sorek Valley is Beth Shemesh. This is where the Ark of the Covenant was returned from the Philistines (1 Samuel 6). Lastly, we travel to the Elah Valley to see where David fought Goliath (1 Samuel 17). We will see the battlefield from either Azekah or Socoh. We drive back to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight.

Day 11 – Friday, February 25: City of David, Hezekiah's Tunnel, Southern Wall Excavations, Western Wall, Jewish Quarter, Garden Tomb

We begin this last day by visiting the City of David and the new excavations of David's palace. Those who want to will take an optional adventurous walk through the water of Hezekiah's Tunnel (1,720 feet long). We then sit on the steps of the Siloam Pool and listen to the story of John 9. From here, we walk up through an exposed Herodian drainage channel that takes us to "Robinson's Arch" and the southern wall excavations. We walk on a Roman street and ascend the Temple steps. Close by is the Western Wall, the most holy place for Jews today! Following a visit here, we will walk to the Jewish Quarter for some free time on our own before ending the day at the Garden Tomb. Here, we will enjoy a brief Communion Service before driving back to our hotel for our

"farewell dinner." Depending on flight schedules, some not doing the Jordan extension will be driven to the airport for their flight home. Others will stay one more night in Jerusalem before driving to the airport for an early morning flight back home or driving to Jordan tomorrow for the start of the optional extension.

Day 12 – Saturday, February 26: Arrive Home

We arrive back in the U.S. today. After going through U.S. Customs, we board our domestic flight back to our respective homes at the end of a life transforming trip!

Day 12 – Saturday, February 26: Drive to Taba Border, Cross into Sinai, Drive to St. Catherine's (Jebel Musa)

We begin the day early with a 3.5 hour drive to Elat and the southern border of Israel. We cross into Egypt at the Taba Border. We meet our Egyptian agent and guide and begin our amazing journey to the heart of the Sinai Desert. We drive along the beautiful Red Sea before heading inland. The granite mountains and sand dunes are majestic! By dinner time, we make it to our hotel near St. Catherine's. Following dinner, we retire for the evening. It will be an early wake-up for those climbing the mountain tomorrow!

Day 13 – Sunday, February 27: Climb up Jebel Musa (Mt. Sinai) at 1:30 a.m., Sunrise on Top, Descent, Drive to Neweiba for Relaxing Afternoon at Red Sea

It is an early wake-up call (1:00 a.m.) for those climbing the mountain today. For those not choosing to hike, you will enjoy a longer sleep and the chance to intercept the hikers coming down off the trail. Those hiking will prepare their flashlights and hiking poles at the trailhead. You will have the option to ride a camel two-thirds up the mountain (cost is around \$30-\$40). There are warming shacks along the way to rest and before the final ascent to the top. The last section involves hiking up about 900 steps (put in place by monks over the last 1,500 years). Our aim is to reach the top by sunrise! The view is spectacular as the sun rises over Saudi Arabia! The descent down will take about two hours. After returning to St. Catherine's Monastery (built in the 4th century AD), we return to our hotel for a breakfast. We load the bus and begin our drive back north. We check in at our beautiful hotel along the Red Sea coastline at Neweiba. Here, we will enjoy the stunning coastline of the Red Sea. You will even get the chance to swim or snorkel among the colorful coral and fish. We enjoy dinner and overnight here.

Day 14 – Monday, February 28: Drive to Taba Border, Re-cross into Israel, Timnah (Tabernacle Model), Machtsh Ramon, Tel Aviv

Following breakfast (and no doubt a stunning sunrise), we begin our drive to the Taba Border. We re-cross into Israel where we meet up with Shlomo and David again (our Israeli guide and driver). We drive to Timnah Park where we will see a full-scale replica to the Tabernacle. A Messianic believer will guide us through the entire model, making Christological connections in amazing ways! We then drive up through Israel's "Grand Canyon" (the Machtsh Ramon). No doubt we will see a few ibex (wild goats) here! Our last drive will take us through the Negev and Shephelah (lowlands) to Tel Aviv. We will check in to our hotel and enjoy dinner one last time before our flight tomorrow morning (depending on flight schedules, some may fly home late tonight).

Day 15 – Tuesday, February 29: Transfer to Ben Gurion Airport, Flight Home

From the hotel, we will drive to the airport for our morning flight back to the States (note: times of flights may vary based on the connections). It has been an incredible trip and extension. We thank God for the many experiences that have enhanced our understanding of the Bible and enriched our walk of faith with Christ!
